IT'S 30 FOR A REASON With the help of PC Paul Temple we are currently looking into the viability of having an 'interactive 30 sign' installed in the village. After routine speed checks carried out by Northumberland County Council it was decided that the average speed of vehicles through the village did not warrant Cornhill having a 'flashing 30 sign'.

After speaking to local residents and businesses it seemed their opinion differed to the NCC. We are therefore in the early stages of finding out facts and figures for purchasing one of these signs ourselves, raising funds through fundraising and donations. As we said we are in the early stages so any ideas on fundraising or anyone with any objections or views are welcome to put them to us.

The approximate cost for one of these signs will be between £3500—4500 but we are sure it will be of huge benefit in the village especially the young and the elderly.

The only way NCC would install one of these signs from their funding would be if there was a 'casualty' as a result of a traffic accident. No-one wants that to happen, we are sure.
